### **About Us**

This year, Readipop turns 25! First established in 1998, we are a specialist music and arts charity. Our projects aim to bring communities together through the shared experience of making and enjoying music. Readipop offers specialist music provision for a wide range of people and partners, including those experiencing complex social issues.

With investment from a range of national funders, including Youth Music and Arts Council England, Readipop has developed its offer to meet local needs. We provide studios, open-access workshops, community projects and an annual music festival. Our projects engage over a thousand regular participants, including aspiring artists and those just discovering their interest in music.

### Who We Are

Our projects are led by the people we work with; young people, artists and the community. Through our sessions, we help build confidence and develop opportunities for the people we work with. Our projects are inclusive, involving musicians of varying skill levels, while celebrating both social and musical diversity.

Creativity is at the heart of Readipop, from our annual music festival, to music education in schools and 1:1 sessions. We listen and help people discover their life paths, as well as their musical talent. Readipop targets the places where the need is greatest in Reading and the Thames Valley. When planning new projects and programmes, we prioritise the needs of marginalised people and those facing barriers or hardship in our local community.

Music Changing Lives is our mission and this appears in many different ways. We host weekly music sessions for community bands, run youth clubs or 1:1 studio sessions for a young person to develop skills and confidence.

### WHAT WE DO

### A Year at Readipop

This post-pandemic year began with a diary packed full of 1:1 referral music sessions, RISER meetings, community band rehearsals, and Festival planning. Eva joined the team as a full-time member, working as the Music Coordinator for Readipop. Our time was spent developing the skills of the young people we were already working with, and making space to include even more!

Summer came with some last-minute drama courtesy of the Sugarhill Gang, however this was quickly sorted by having Grandmaster Flash step in to headline the Saturday of Readipop Festival 2022. He also signed a pair of turntables for our new XOX electronic music heritage project. The sun was out, the site was filled and the team were busy keeping the festival running! We also hosted our first festival 'AAA Takeover' with local young people performing to the festival crowds.

September launched us back into the school term and more referral sessions. Readipop offered our stage, back line, and Studio Technician to Reading Pride and ran the Pride aLive stage! With the start of the school year came lots of team CPD (Continuous Professional Development) from ukulele and djembe to DJ skills.

The main highlight of Autumn was learning that we'd retained our status as a National Portfolio Organisation of the Arts Council England for another three years. This was celebrated in the office with the team and trustees of Readipop.

In December, thankfully we were able to have our AGM and Hootenanny in person for the first time since 2019. It featured live performances from our young people, community bands, and RISER artists, as well as the introduction of Molly joining the team as our Festival Producer for Readipop Festival 2023.

We had another busy February half term thanks to the Princes' Trust "Get Started With Music" Programme. From which the majority of participants then joined our AAA Friday Youth Club and still come to this day!

For a satisfying end to the year, Readipop held a 303 event on the 3rd of March at South Street Arts Centre in celebration of the Roland TB-303. Headlined by Saytek Live, we had synth enthusiasts join us for a night of live electronic music using original Roland Synths.

### Readipop Programmes 2022-2023

Readipop projects are always evolving based on the need in the local area and 2022 to 2023 was no different. This year we were looking to make our projects even more accessible to participants following the various COVID-19 lockdowns. With some being entirely open access, and others specifically targeted for what is necessary in the area, here's an overview of the projects we ran between 2022 and 2023.

# **ACCESS ALL AREAS**

#### 'AAA' - ACCESS ALL AREAS

Readipop's AAA (Access All Areas) programme brings together a number of projects designed to engage and support young people and their music.



MUSIC BASED
MENTORING

Working with young people referred to us from places including pupil referral units, the young offenders service, schools specialising in special educational needs students and other children's services. These 1:1 Music sessions provide young people with a safe space to be creative and learn skills, from guitar to music production and rapping, all with an experienced music leader. The sessions aim to grow confidence and awaken opportunities.



OPEN ACCESS SESSIONS A weekly, term-time evening workshop allowing young musicians to work together in live band workshops, music production and/or studio work.



IN THE

Working with young musicians from the Amersham Road (and surrounding areas) at the Weller Centre, Caversham on Monday afternoons.



GET STARTED WITH MUSIC In partnership with The Prince's Trust, this is a one-week intensive music project for young people aged 16-25 who are NEET (not in education, employment or training).

ARTS WARDS Arts Awards are a set of qualifications ranging from exploratory and creative early learning, up to AS level equivalent.
Readipop helps hundreds complete Arts Awards across schools and within our provision.



FAMILY JAM A family music session for kids and adults to experience and learn to play together. Held on the first Saturday of every month at Readipop Studios.



PRIMARY SCHOOL WORKSHOP A variety of engaging, creative workshops for schools, from half-day taster workshops to regular projects enabling children to learn new instruments.

## OTHER WORK

### **Community Bands**

Lead by experienced, professional musicians who create a fun and sociable space in which to make and play music together. Readipop's community band sessions are open to beginners and the more experienced players.



### **XOX Music Heritage Project**



XOX is an electronic music heritage project lead by Readipop, and built around a collection of classic beatboxes, synths, FX and more. XOX brings workshops to schools and colleges as well as creating the XOX lab at Readipop Studios where musicians can access the instruments to make and record new music.

### **Readipop Festival**

Readipop festival is a homegrown, charity festival run by Readipop, for three days by the river Thames. Platforming local Berkshire-based artists and bands alongside big name headliners such as Grandmaster Flash. All the proceeds from the festival go back into the charity so that we can continue our work within the community.



#### RISER



RISER is a not for profit, ethical music label for new music and artists run by Readipop. Readipop supports musicians at a critical stage in their career development to manage initial releases and build an audience so that the artists can focus on the creative process.
